Your parents do intend to be cremated?

- Yes, that is their request.

You understand that only one monument and one flat marker may be placed per plot. Currently each Pletzer plot has an existing monument.

- Yes, that is the understanding that we had from previous communications.

You indicate your father's grandparents are laid to rest in the Cemetery, however no mention of your father's parents? Is that correct?

Lastly, is there any documentation representing the recollection of your father's regarding his and his wife's interment, or was it solely a verbal conversation?

Hello again Erica,

It is indeed unfortunate that there has been some miscommunication between members of the Pletzer family and representatives of the Municipality of Magnetawan.

When the Municipality took over the Orange Valley Road Cemetery not that many years ago, they purchased some land adjacent to the cemetery from my parents in order to create an access road to the cemetery. My father (who is now 95 years of age) recalled that part of the land purchase agreement

provided that he and my mother (now 90 years of age) have the option to be buried in the Orange Valley Road Cemetery. My father was born in the current farmhouse that they still own in the Valley. He and my mother raised their family and lived on the farm in Orange Valley for their entire marriage (now 67 years) and it has been their wish and expectation that they would be interred in the Orange Valley Cemetery upon the time of their passing.

Is there any way that the Cemetery Board and the Municipality can at least honour this commitment to my parents?

On behalf of my parents I respectfully ask that you bring this matter back to the Cemetery Board for review and consideration.

Afternoon Dan,

Thank you for following up regarding the Cemetery Boards decision.

I understand your disappointment in the decision but did want to let you know that the Board discussed your request at length as there are many factors to consider.

The Board noted the Orange Valley Cemetery has been closed since the last burial in 1956 (Wark). At the time the Municipality took over care and maintenance of the Cemetery, they were not able to secure any mapping or gridding of the cemetery and/or burials including unknown ones. Knowing the duration of time that has past since the last burial(s), no mapping of burials, along with current expectations in place by the Bereavement Authority of Ontario regarding the municipality's duty to all original interment rights holders, the Board was unable to support the request.

I appreciate there may have been some miscommunication in the past, however, I can't speak to those discussions as I was not present.

Good morning Erica,

Thank you for your correspondence.

I must say that I and immediate family members/descendants of Rodney and Eileen Pletzer are very surprised and deeply disappointed to receive the information that you recently conveyed, considering that was not what we (my brother, my father and myself) were told this summer in regard to my family's inquiry into our future use of the Orange Valley Road Cemetery.

You noted that our (my) request for the interment of 16 cremated remains could not be supported. Is there an alternate maximum number of possible interments of cremated remains using the known and identified casket burial sites in the cemetery?

There are 6 known, recorded and marked sites of immediate Pletzer family members 2 of which include my father's grandparents. Based on previous information provided to us, that would allow for 2 interred cremations per site (maximum of 12).

We would appreciate knowing whether a smaller number of interred cremations can be approved. If this is not possible, we would appreciate an explanation as to why the previous information provided to us has changed.

Subject: St. Paul's Lutheran Cemetery on Wurm Road

> Dear Ms. Bloom,

> My name is Yvonne Wolfram and I am writing to you in regards to the St. Paul's Lutheran Cemetery located on Wurm Road in the municipality of Magnetawan. This cemetery is located on property formerly owned by my cousin, Eva Marszewski (copied above), who continues to own the farm lands, farmhouse, and adjacent buildings which once belonged to the Wurm family.

> Our families spent many happy summers at this farmhouse, and eventually my parents purchased a cottage on Chapman Drive which they owned for over 30 years. My cousin Eva has built a cottage at 142 Wurm Road (across the road from the entrance to this cemetery) where our families continue to enjoy many happy gatherings each year.

> Unfortunately, both my parents have passed away in the past few years, and the urns with their cremated remains are at my brother's house. It has taken my siblings and me time to decide on a suitable final resting place for our parents, and we all came to the conclusion that this cemetery would be the perfect location for the following reasons.

>

> My parents (Tadeusz and Romualda Wolfram), who were both born in Warsaw, Poland, prior to World War II, were Lutheran Volksdeutsche, and were subjected to religious persecution in a country that was predominantly Catholic. My father's family managed to escape from Poland in 1944, but my mother's family was not as fortunate due to the fact that my mother was shot by a stray bullet and required medical attention. The window of opportunity for my mother's entire family to evacuate Poland prior to the end of the war closed due to the time it took for her to recover from her injuries. Consequently, another opportunity to evacuate didn't present itself until 1958. In the meantime my mother's parents, grandparents, and brother were all jailed for treason, given their Volksdeutsche status, and my mother was separated from her entire family for 7 years. Those intervening years were marked by various hardships including her separation from her entire family during her formative years, as well as living under a communist regime. By the time they were finally reunited, both of my mother's grandparents had died, and her brother was conscripted into the Polish Army and was not released until 1972.

>

> My parents eventually met in Germany in the early 1960s and when my brother was 6 months old, my parents made the decision to move to Canada, where my cousin Eva Marszewski's family had already settled some years earlier. My parents and Eva's family became members of the St. John's Polish Lutheran Church in Toronto where they found a sense of community and belonging with other Volksdeutsche who underwent similar experiences during the war. Both my parents were devout and their Lutheran faith sustained them throughout their lives. My parents often said how fortunate they felt to have immigrated to a country which respects religious freedoms. While spending time at the farmhouse or cottage in the summertime, my parents also attended St Paul's Lutheran Church in Magnetawan over the years.

>

> As a child during one of these summer visits to the farmhouse, I remember exploring the property with my siblings and stumbling upon this cemetery. At the time, the cemetery was quite overgrown and looked like something out of a Stephen King movie. Over the years, various members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church approached my aunt, Zofia Marszewski, asking that she help them find the cemetery. Each time she obliged and walked across the fields and into the bush to find the cemetery. After my aunt passed away in 2000, my cousin Eva was approached by members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church with a request that she allow the construction of a roadway to provide access for the descendants of those buried in the cemetery. After lengthy discussions as to the location of the entrance, the width and allowances for the road access, the precise boundary of the cemetery, the location of the fencing as well as a secure gate to ensure that there would not be unsupervised access that would enable random mischief and potential liability, they agreed to survey the agreed-upon parcels and she agreed to donate the land to enable a permanent access to the cemetery from Wurm Road. As a result, an appropriate entrance and road access were created to enable church members and descendants of those buried in the cemetery to visit their ancestors.

>

> Many years after the death of my uncle Piotr Marszewski, my aunt Zofia married Reverend Helmut Pruefer, a Lutheran Pastor from Kitchener, Ontario. Over the years, Reverend Pruefer was asked to officiate at Magnetawan's St. Paul's Lutheran Church and deliver the sermons during the absences of the incumbent Pastor. My aunt Zofia has also contributed financially to the town of Magnetawan when it was raising funds to build a Community Centre. I believe that her name is noted on one of the plaques at the Center.

>

> I mention all of the above details to demonstrate that my family have well-established roots in Magnetawan and how devout my family was in their Lutheran faith.

>

> In speaking with Pastor Christian at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, I was led to understand that this cemetery is currently designated inactive. However, he suggested that perhaps I could try to appeal to the members of the Magnetawan Town Council to ask that my sister, brother and I be allowed to bury our parents' urns at this cemetery.

>

> I would also like to mention that in the last couple of years, my brother Albert has been diagnosed with early onset Alzheimer's. As his mental capacities continue to slowly decline, my sister Dorothy and I felt it was particularly important to try to bury our parents' urns as soon as possible.

>

> In light of my family's connection to the property on which the cemetery lies and indeed their well established roots in the Magnetawan area, in addition to my family's devout Lutheran faith, I am seeking the town's consideration in allowing the burial of my parents' urns in the cemetery. We would be eager to hold the burial ceremony this summer, due to my brother's declining state. This also means that my sister, brother and I could visit my parents' graves whenever we spend time with my cousin Eva at her cottage across the road.

>

> My family would also be happy to make a donation to St. Paul's Lutheran Church, and perhaps the planting of a special memorial tree.

>

> Thank you for your consideration and I look forward to hearing from you.

**Recommendation:** THAT the Board receives and approves this report as presented and forwards the report and motion to Council for information.

### **Background:**

During the October 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021, Cemetery Board meeting, discussion around interment rights in the absence of the original Interment Rights Holder took place. Members requested active and non-active cemeteries be defined.

### **Evaluation:**

The Cemetery Board has authority to administer a total of ten cemeteries held by the Municipality of Magnetawan. Of the ten cemeteries there are three that remain active; interment rights are actively being sold and interments are taking place.

All remaining cemeteries are either honoring historic interment rights while others are inactive as they are not accessible for interments or sale. Since 2016 these remaining cemeteries have not had any interments or sales.

The intention behind inactive status is to cease the sale of future interments and to prevent interments outside of the original Interment Rights Holder contract.

There are no formal statutes within the *Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act*, that define or identify the requirements to be labeled "inactive". There are also no formal documents to file with the Bereavement Authority of Ontario (BAO) to deem a cemetery 'inactive', however, as the governing authority, the BAO should be consulted if the Board considers changing the status of a cemetery.

In order to deem a cemetery inactive, the BAO recommends the cemetery operator take the following steps.

1. Confirm the number of interments that remain unfulfilled.
2. Confirm that of those interments how will they be handled if the cemetery is deemed inactive.
3. Notify the public of the intent to deem a cemetery inactive and that there will not be any future sales of cemetery rights within that cemetery. All existing interments that have not been fulfilled will be honored.
4. Pass a motion requesting the BAO considered the cemeteries for inactive status.

5. If approved by the BAO, the cemetery would be deemed inactive and no future interment sales or interments would be made.
6. The cemetery once inactive, would be maintained in perpetuity by the Municipality.

With respect to Care and Maintenance (CM) held in Trust by the municipality, nothing changes. The municipality is still required to report the funds annually and only use the funds as provided in the legislation.

'Inactive' and 'closed' cemeteries are two terms that are often used interchangeably when describing cemeteries that have not had ongoing interments or sales. However, closing a cemetery is a lengthy process and requires all remains to be disinterred then reinterred. Thus, it is not recommended to request the closing of a cemetery or refer to a cemetery as being closed.

**Financial Implications:**


Ceasing to sell interment rights removes future revenue for the Cemetery Board for each cemetery considered inactive.

**Conclusion:** The Municipality maintains three active and seven inactive cemeteries, therefore, it is in the best interest of the Board to request that the BAO deem the seven cemeteries as inactive. Honouring only original Interment Rights Holders and ceasing to sell any new interment rights or granting burials for descendants of original Interment Rights Holders.

**Recommendation:** THAT the Cemetery Board receives and approves this report as presented and as of April 15th, 2022, no interments outside of original Interment Rights Holders will take place nor will any new Interment Rights be sold within any Inactive Cemetery.

**Background:**

This report is to provide additional information to the Board regarding the November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2021 Report – Inactive versus Active Cemeteries. Members requested the Secretary confirm any outstanding interment rights prior to deeming any cemetery within the Municipality inactive.

**Evaluation:**

The municipality currently has three active cemeteries, and six inactive cemeteries. As noted in the November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2021 report, the difference between active and inactive is the sale of new Interment Rights (plot sales).

A search of Cemetery Board Minutes indicates in 2016, the Board affirmed two interments in the St. Johns Dufferin Cemetery. Minutes recorded in 2016 acknowledge permission and that the plots had been staked out; however, staff believe these Rights have not been exercised. These are the only interments found in Minutes with respect to current inactive cemeteries.

The Parks & Maintenance Manager has confirmed there have been no interments or new Interment Rights sold in the six currently inactive cemeteries in the past five years.

**Options:**

The Board has 2 options:

- 1) Remain status quo.
- 2) Deem all cemeteries that are not selling new Interment Rights as Inactive.

**Financial Implications:** None

**Conclusion:** The current Cemeteries offering new Interment Rights are: Spence, Ahmic and Chapman which are considered active and open.

The current inactive Cemeteries include, St. John, Dufferin Methodist, Orange Valley, Port Carmen, Rock Hill, St. John's and Sequin Cemeteries.
