Q#1: Regarding the performance security, is a 10% bid bond or an agreement to bond (confirming a 10% performance bond) acceptable? The requirement of 10% performance bond upfront differs from a 10% bid bond as it is only provided after the project is awarded.

A#1: No, the Municipality is requesting a performance bond as it guarantees that the proponent will fulfill their obligations under the contract, including completing the work to the specified standards and within the agreed upon timeframe. If the proponent fails to perform, the Municipality can make a claim against the performance bond. A bid bond only ensures that the contractor will actually enter into the contract if their bid is successful as a claim can only be made against the bid bond if the proponent wins the RFP but fails to sign the contract.
